PREPARATION

- 1. WE STRONGLY RECOMMEND THAT A LICENSED AND INSURED PROFESSIONAL CONTRACTOR TO INSTALL THIS PRODUCT INCLUDING THE ASSISTANCE OF A SECOND PERSON DURING INSTALLATION.
- 2. After opening all boxes and packages, read this introduction carefully. Check that all of the needed parts are included in the package by marking all the components on the "Detailed Diagram of Shower Door Components". Examine boxes and packages for shipping damage. If the unit has been damaged, has a finishing defect, or is missing parts, please contact our customer support department to be served immediately. Please note that Woodbridge will not replace any damaged products or missing parts free of charge after 5 business days or if the product has been installed. Feel free to contact Woodbridge if you have any questions.
 - VERY IMPORTANT: Please double check the glass corner and four edges of the glass door and fixed panel to make sure that all the glass are in perfect condition and without any breakage. Please do not try to install the shower door, if there is breakage to the glass corner.
- 3. Please note that you should consult your local building codes with questions on installation compliance standards. Building and plumbing codes may vary by location, and Woodbridge is not responsible for code compliance standards for your project and will not accept any returns.
- 4. Prior to installation, ensure that the installation surface is leveled and solid and will be able to support the total weight of the unit. Also, make sure the walls are at the right angles. Irregular installation surface level or improper angle of side walls will result in serious problems during installation. Please, note that some adjustments and drilling might be necessary during the installation process.
- 5. NOTE! This door does not have out-of-plumb adjustment. Make sure your walls are at right angles.
- 6. This door requires a minimum 2 3/4" wide threshold, base or installation space. Please note that Step 6 calls for installation of the door to the wall using anchors. However, the manufacturer strongly recommends installing these heavy doors to the studs or to preinstalled 2" x 4" wood reinforcements behind the wall and attach the Wall brackets to it.










1. Your Upper Guide Rail (15) and Anti-Splash Aluminum Threshold (9) have been precut for your shower model opening width: 48" or 60". If W-width of your wall to wall opening is equal to the size of your shower model, it is not necessary to cut the guide rail and threshold and you can continue to step 2.

If W width of your wall to wall opening is less than the size of your shower model, you will need to cut the guide rail (from the the end which is farther from the Glass Bracket (14) and the threshold (from the end w/o the groove). The end to cut off will be L: L= Subtract W from the size of your shower model.


2. Place the Anti-Splash Aluminum Threshold (9) to the shower tray or shower base. Using a level to adjust the threshold horizontal, make sure the threshold level.











3. Make the marks through the Anti-Splash Aluminum Threshold (9) for drilling. Now drill the holes with drill bit Φ8mm(Ø5/16"), and Apply silicone into the holes on the wall. Insert the Wall Anchor (7).








4. Apply silicone from top to bottom along the back edge (edge facing the shower base) of **Anti-splash Aluminum Threshold (9)**. Fasten the threshold to the shower base or shower tray with **Round Head Screw M4X30 (6)**. Put the **Screw Cover (5)** to cover the screw in the threshold. Put the Glass Bracket to Anti-splash Aluminum Threshold.

5. Use the allen key (21) to loose the screw on the guide rail bracket (20) and glass door stopper (19). Slide the stopper and then the bracket to the guide rail (15).

6. Loose the screw of the Glass Bracket (14) and then align the screw hole of the glass bracket with the hole of the Fixed Glass (13), fasten the fixed glass with to Guide Rail (15).







7. Put the Fixed Glass Assembly with the **Guide** Rail (15) into the slot of the **Anti-Splash** Aluminum Threshold (9).













WOODBRIDGE® 1. $\pm\,0.0$ 3. 8. Now, level your **Upper Guide Rail(15)** and tighten up the **Glass Bracket (14)** and **Fixed** Glass (13) with Alleny Key(21). See Figure 9 for details. Figure 9




9. Align the **Upper Guide Rail (15)** and make it horizontal, and then slide the **Guide Rail Bracket (20)** to attach to the wall. Outline the position of the guide rail bracket on the wall. Put the fixed glass assy away and remove the guide rail bracket from the upper guide rail by loosing the screw on it, and then place the **Wall Bracket (20A)** of the guide rail bracket on the outlined position and mark down the holes for drilling. Now drill the holes with drill bit Φ8mm(5/16") and insert the **Wall Anchor (7)** and then fasten wall bracket to the wall with **Round Head Screw M5X60 (2)**.












10. Put the Fixed Glass Assembly into the Anti-Splash Aluminum Threhold (9) again, now slide the guide rail brackets toward the wall and push it against the wall. Use Allen Key (21) to tighten up the screws of the brackets. Slide the Side PVC Strip(12) into the slot of the threshold, between the Fixed Glass (13) and the threshold.







11. Place the **Guide Block (10)** on the shower base or shower tray and parallel it to the **Fixed Glass (13).** It should not pass beyond the vertical edge of the glass. Take a measurement to ensure the distance between the front line of the glass and the center line of the Guide block is 1 3/16". Hold the guide block firmly and mark down the drilling hole on the shower base or shower tray. Remove the Guide block, now drill the hole using Ø 5/16" drill bit, insert the **Wall Anchor (7)** in and then fasten the Guide block to the shower base or shower tray with the **Countersunk Screw M5X30 (8).**



12. Slide the **Side Anti-water Strip (16)** to the **Fixed Glass (13)**, remove the flapper that interferes with the **Guide Rail (15)**.

13. Install the Handle (3) and Rollers (18) to the Glass Door (4), place Anti-Water Strip (16) and Bumper Strip (1) to the glass door as well. Remember to remove the flapper that interferes with the Guide Rail (15).









14. Hang the Glass Door Assembly to the **Guide Rail (15)**, make sure that the **Rollers (18)** are against the guide rail, now adjust the **Glass Door (4)** and slide the bottom edge of the glass door into the groove of the **Guide Block (10)**.









15. Install the **Safety Pin (17)** to the **Glass Door (4)**. The roller is off-centre, adjust the roller to make the glass door move higher or lower and make sure that the glass door will not rub against the **Guide Block (10)** and ensure the bumper strip to push against the wall.
